Three transversal thematics: digitization, environment and inclusion

FEDER - CF - FSE

Budget: 373 billion euros

Beside the criteria of GDP per capita, new criteria are added (youth unemployment, low education level, climate change, and the reception and integration of migrants)

FEDER - CF - FSE

A smarter Europe, through innovation, digitisation, economic transformation and support to small and medium-sized businesses

A greener, carbon free Europe, implementing the Paris Agreement and investing in energy transition, renewables and the fight against climate change

A more connected Europe, with strategic transport and digital networks

A more social Europe, delivering on the European Pillar of Social Rights and supporting quality employment, education, skills, social inclusion and equal access to healthcare

A Europe closer to citizens, by supporting locally-led development strategies and sustainable urban development across the EU.

Horizon Europe

Budget: 100 billion euros

Series of clusters in 'Global Challenges and Industrial Competitiveness': health, bio, etc.

As example: Inclusive and Secure Societies

Budget: 9,2 billion euros

Life Programme

Budget: 5,45 billion euros

Environment sub-programme

Funding for nature conservation projects in particular in the areas of biodiversity, habitats and species.

Climate action sub-programme

Funding for projects in the areas of renewable energies, energy efficiency, farming, land use, and peatland management.

Erasmus+

Budget: 30 billion euros

It provides learning and mobility opportunities to 12 million people, in comparison to 4 million people in the current programme.

It will continue to cover schools, vocational education and training, higher education and adult learning - youth and sport, but in a more streamlined manner.

It will promote activities which foster knowledge and awareness of the EU, opportunities in forward-looking knowledge fields e.g. climate change, robotics etc. and better outreach and inclusion of people with fewer opportunities
